

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen and at least 18 years of age.
- A current student enrolled at least half time in an accredited college (including 4-year colleges/ universities, community colleges, and junior colleges); professional, technical, vocational, and trade school; advanced degree programs; or other qualifying educational institution pursuing a qualifying degree or certificate.
- Must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Must not be simultaneously funded by DoD via another appointment, scholarship, or fellowship.
- Must be able to obtain and maintain a favorable background investigation or meet security clearance requirements for the position.

PROGRAM INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS:

- Interns may be hired on a temporary basis for up to 1 year (Temporary), which can be extended at the supervisor's discretion.
- The Intern's position should be related to his/her academic career goals or field of study.
- Interns may work either a full-time or part-time work schedule.
- Each Intern must sign a Participant Agreement that sets forth the expectations for the internship.

OUR PROGRAMS

STEM STUDENT EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (SSEP)

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The SSEP offers civilian internship opportunities for students enrolled (or accepted for enrollment) in an academic program in pursuit of Scientific, Technical, Engineering or Mathematical (STEM) courses of study leading to a bachelor's or advanced degree. Those who have successfully completed program requirements may be noncompetitively converted to temporary, term, or permanent positions in the federal service at Soldier Center.

NON-STEM STUDENT EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (PAACTSEP)

The Professional, Administrative, Assistant, Clerical and Technician Student Employment Program (PAACTSEP) offers federal internship and employment opportunities for current non-STEM students enrolled in secondary, post-secondary, or technical degree programs. PACCTSEP permits non-competitive placement of non-STEM students to Temporary, Term, or Flexible Length Student Term appointments. Upon successful completion of degree or certificate program, and successful completion of PAACTSEP requirements, students may be eligible for conversion to a term, flexible length and renewable term, or permanent appointment in the Civil Service.



THE ARMY FELLOWS PROGRAM (AFP)

The Army Fellows Program (AFP) is a two-year, fulltime, entry-level employment program designed to train talented individuals as interns with the requisite skills, abilities, and competencies for placement in the Army civilian workforce. At Soldier Center, AFP candidates are Recent College Graduates, including military Veterans. Army Fellows will be placed in entrylevel positions and developed for key positions within a particular career program through a combination of progressive and sequential work assignments, formal training, and self-development. Upon successful completion, AFP Fellows may be non-competitively converted into a permanent civilian position.



STUDENT VOLUNTEER PROGRAM (SVP)

The Student Volunteer Program (SVP) provides education-related work assignments and training to students in an unpaid status. Student Volunteers will have the opportunity to explore career options while gaining valuable work experience in preparation for paid opportunities within the federal government. Ideally, Student Volunteers will be assigned to work in their areas of interest and field of study. SVP service will be conducted under the supervision of a federal Soldier Center employee. Student Volunteers may be eligible to receive academic credit or a stipend for their participation in this program through their academic institution.
